

Deaths & Burials

1882

- Oct. 8, 1882 (p. 49–50) “Pete Walls - his baby died”
- Nov. 22, 1882 (p. 55) “helped dig a grave bury Nannie Brighams baby”
- Nov. 23, 1882 (p. 55) “helped bury 3 of Green Moodys children”
- Dec 23, 1882 (p. 60) “I went to Springville & got Hud to come
& help me make a coffin for Little Elmer. He died with the
membranous croup. buried him in the afternoon.

1883

- Feb 17, 1883 (p. 68, 69) “Mary [Buchanan] died”. Billie & I went to Peter Buchanan to set up Mary died.
- Oct 9, 1883 (p. 100) “John ... speak the burial of Herds babe” → Infant death (Herd family)
- 16 Oct 1883 (p.101) “I set with one of Roberts men over at the stove factory, the old man died.
Oh! what a time we did have laying him out.
- 20 Oct 1883 (p.102) Load of stove wood at nearly sun set the mill out- fit sent for me to come &
help wash & dress Roberts that died this morning.

1885

- Mar 21, 1885 (p.51) “went to Poplar grove...” “Ed Nashes wife buried”
- April 1, 1885 (p. 46) “Bud Parker deceased”
- Dec 20, 1885 (p. 77) “went to see John Clendenin buried”
- Feb 20, 1886 (p. 86) “we went to the burying of Mr Linzie & I went in time to help to dig the grave.”

1888

- Feb 4, 1888 (p. 101) “... our Freddie died about ½ past 2 oclock”

1889

- Feb 1, 1889 (p.109) “Papa helped dig grave for Mr Coxs little baby.”

Births (Indirect / Implied)

Jun 15, 1887 (p.99)	“another man child born to us all right.” [Child of George Dortch, little Ulie Baby p 101]
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Marriages - Paris, Tennessee

Mar. 4, 1883 (p. 71)	Emerson Stem – married yesterday.
Mar 8, 1884 (p10)	“Clark Married”
Mar 13, 1884 (p10)	Clark & John F married at 1:00 1885 p49 – Mar 1 “John Finch came back from Ark. 1889 p106 - “John and Aunt Clark with us a while to night”
Mar 24, 1885 (p51)	Tommie & Ella Perry married

Religious Rites

Nov. 25, 1882 (p. 56)	“Hud Parker & his wife were baptized”
May 29, 1885 (p.58)	“31 Sun...we went to the creek & Bro Osborne baptized Sid Lowery & wife.”
Oct 12, 1885 (p. 71)	“Bro James Parker & wife & Ella Dortch & Sister Lofton of Union City were baptized...”
Feb 3, 1887 (p. 92)	“baptism... Mary Ellis from Arkansas”
Feb 7, 1889 (p.109)	“I went to the ridge to see Mr Wilse baptized”
